Agustin Rodriguez, de 85 años, de Harlingen, Texas, fue llamado a la presencia del Señor y entró en la vida eterna de manera pacífica. Deja un legado de trabajo arduo, disciplina, humildad y amor.

Nació el 14 de mayo de 1940 en Santo Domingo, San Luis Potosí, México, hijo de Alberto Loyola y Guadalupe Rodriguez. momentos especiales y reuniones familiares, poniendo a su familia en primer lugar.

En sus últimos años, encontraba paz sentado en su mecedora afuera de su hogar, apreciando la naturaleza y observando a los pájaros que llegaban a la fuente a beber agua. Fue un hombre de pocas palabras, pero sincero en todo lo que decía. Vivió con valores de compasión, generosidad e integridad, siempre dispuesto a ayudar sin esperar nada a cambio.

Su memoria vivirá en las canciones que cantaba, las historias que contaba, la alegría que compartía y el amor que brindó. Se mantuvo fuerte hasta el último momento, luchando con valentía, pero preparado para reunirse con sus seres queridos en el cielo. Su familia guarda la esperanza de volver a verlo y atesorará por siempre los hermosos recuerdos que dejó.

El velorio se llevará a cabo el viernes 24 de abril de 2026, de 1:00 p.m. a 9:00 p.m., con el rezo del rosario a las 7:00 p.m. Los servicios funerarios se celebrarán el sábado 25 de abril de 2026, saliendo de Rudy Garza Funeral Home a las 9:30 a.m. para una misa de cuerpo presente a las 10:00 a.m. en la Iglesia Católica Our Lady of the Assumption. Agustin was a devout Catholic and faithful believer in God. He attended Mass and always made sure to light a candle at home and pray for his loved ones and for those who needed prayer. He prayed the rosary daily and instilled in his children and grandchildren that prayer was important and that God was always with us. He would say, "Que Dios te cuide," when saying goodbye before work or before traveling.

Among the things he enjoyed in life were watching soccer, coloring, doing yard work, and listening attentively to music, learning songs and melodies. Music was an outlet that brought him memories and joy.

In his younger years, he played soccer, cards, and dominoes, and spent time with family and friends.

However, in his last days here on earth, he would sit outside in his rocking chair and appreciate nature by watching the birds come to the fountain to drink water. He was a man of few words, but he was sincere and meant what he said.

He instilled in his family values and morals that consisted of giving a helping

hand when possible without expecting anything in return. He demonstrated what it meant to care for one another and wanted his children to continue that legacy while maintaining a positive relationship with each other.

The memory he leaves behind will consist of singing, jokes, inside stories, love, compassion, and integrity. He was full of strength until the very last moment and fought a great fight, but ultimately he was ready to reunite with his loved ones in Heaven.

Visitation will begin Friday, April 24, 2026, at 1:00 PM and continue until 9:00 PM, with a rosary to be prayed at 7:00 PM.
